*“Our dad is a Delivery Driver for Eastern Propane & Oil. He drives a propane delivery truck, which is also known as a bobtail.”*




*“Propane isn’t just used inside the home. Some of my favorite things to do outside are powered by propane!”*

- *Helps control weeds and insects*
- *Powers heavy equipment and farm vehicles*
- *Propane powered dryers for corn or soy beans*
- *Space heating in greenhouses*
- *Frost protection in the fields*
- *Propane fueled energy-efficient irrigation pumps*
- *Standby generators*
